1. Does the inclusion of Rahab the prostitute in this list surprise you? What does it tell us about God’s character towards sinners who put their faith in Him?
2. What challenges do you face today where God is asking you to trust Him when it doesn’t appear to make sense? How does this passage motivate you to press on in faith?
3. How should God’s faithfulness affect how we understand and view our circumstances? Do you think you are ready to suffer for the Name of Christ when or if persecution comes your way? What can you do today to help you be prepared? How did Daniel prepare to suffer for the sake of righteousness in Daniel 1:5-16 (particularly v. 8)?
4. What does it mean to have a future-looking faith? How did all of the Old Testament believers in Hebrews 11 demonstrate a future-oriented faith? In what ways are New Covenant believers called to have a future-oriented faith as well?
