### The Structure of Psalm 28

- **Prayer** (v. 1) [complementary to the praise of vv. 7-9]
  - “**Hear** the voice of my pleas” (v. 2) [which is answered in v. 6]
    - The **Reason** (vv. 3-5) [Here is the CORE truth to be understood]
    - “He has **heard** the voice of my pleas” (v. 6)
- **Praise** (vv. 7-9)
